**Bikeability** : We are really excited to have secured funding for all of our year 6 children to take part in bikeability on **Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th January 2022**. We are hoping to secure this for other Year groups in the near future.

## About Bikeability

Bikeability is our national cycle training scheme. It's like cycling proficiency, but better. It's about gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle on today's roads. There are three Bikeability levels, each designed to improve cycling skills.

Level 2 is delivered on local, residential roads. It gives riders a real cycling experience that equips them with skills to deal with traffic on short local journeys, such as cycling to school or the local shops. Level 2 will encourage and develop safe cycling skills, develop positive attitudes towards road use, increase knowledge and understanding of the road and traffic environment and give riders the confidence to use their bicycles on local roads.
