Y2 Key question:

How do we make things fair for farmers?

English

We begin with the class text 'The Deep Dark wood'. Our writing opportunities include a character description, writing the story of Little Red Riding Hood from the wolf's point of view, and a set of instructions on how to look after an animal. Our language choices will include using adjectives, powerful verbs and adverbs. We will look at all four sentence types.

Our second-class text is 'Jim and the Beanstalk'. This will involve narrative writing including dialogue. The children will also write to the coop to request a visit to support their learning. We will look at both formal and informal language choices. There will be a focus on using co-ordination and subordination in our sentences.

Geography/history

In geography, we will learn about urban and rural land use in the UK, the products available to us from farms in the UK and from Kenya. We will compare the human and physical geography of Kenya and the UK. We will also consider the impact of climate change in the different regions and consider what we can do to help.

Art/DT

We will research, plan and make a healthy meal that could be grown on a local farm. It will need to give a farmer enough energy to get through a working day.

Enrichment

We will visit Tatton Farm gardens to see how the food is grown and then ends up on our plates at home.

We will visit to the co-operative to discuss fair trade for farmers around the world. We will create a shopping list and compare prices between fair trade products and non-fair-trade products.

Maths

The children will learn what multiplication and division means and learn a range of strategies to work out problems involving these. This will include drawing groups, arrays and number lines
