Sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves and the world around them including the intangible

Use of their imagination and creativity In their learning

Willingness to reflect on their experiences.

The Doughnut Analogy\_Through our daily worship, we have been exploring the concept of 'spirituality' and spiritual development with our children. We began thinking about a ring doughnut. We explained simply that there is a hole inside all of

us that needs filling in order for us to be whole. It's an invisible hole that is filled when we feel a connection to something bigger than ourselves and find meaning in our lives, resulting in peace and joy.

The children discussed what aspects of their lives help them to fill their spiritual hole. Below are a few examples.

When I draw, I fell like I am in my own world and it makes me feel whole. I feel free.

When I give things to

people and make

them smile..

When I go outside and feel the breeze flowing in my face, it makes me feel calm.

> When we are all together for worship I feel calm and blessed.

I like taking care of animals, stroking them and making them feel happy.

> Running to the top of a hill and looking at the beautiful hills.

When my mum or my friends give me a big hug. I feel worry free.

> I feel calm and relaxed when I look up at the sky full of stars. I wonder is there more to life out there?
